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The Grand Jury charges:

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#### INTRODUCTORY ALLEGATIONS

In approximately 1997, defendant KEVIN JAMES, aka 1. 3 "Shakyh Shahaab Murshid," aka "Abdul-Wahid Ash-Sheena," aka "As-4 Sudaani," aka "Ash-Shafi'e," aka "Ash Shakyh Sudani," aka 5 "Shahaab Murshid Adbdul-Wahid Sudani," aka "Shihab James," aka 6 "Abdul Wahid," aka "Shahaab Murshid," aka "Shahaab James," 7 ("JAMES"), a California prison inmate, founded an organization 8 entitled Jam'iyyat Ul-Islam Is-Saheeh ("JIS") based on his 9 radical interpretation of Islam. 10

Defendant JAMES preached the duty of JIS members to
 target for violent attack any enemies of Islam or "infidels,"
 including the United States Government and Jewish and non-Jewish
 supporters of Israel.

3. Defendant JAMES actively recruited his fellow prison inmates to join JIS by clandestinely distributing a document or "protocol," which set forth defendant JAMES' religious teachings about Islam, including the justification for killing infidels or non-believers, and guidelines to be followed by JIS members ("JIS Protocol").

4. Defendant JAMES required prospective JIS members to
 take an oath of obedience to him and swear not to disclose the
 existence of JIS. Defendant JAMES also required prospective JIS
 members to swear that they would obey a ninety day contact rule,
 wherein they would communicate with defendant JAMES at least once
 during every ninety day period.

5. In addition to his recruitment efforts inside prison,
defendant JAMES also sought to establish groups or "cells" of JIS

members outside of prison which would carry out violent attacks
 against perceived infidels, including the United States
 Government, the Government of Israel, and Jewish persons.

6. In and around November 2004, defendant LEVAR
WASHINGTON, aka "Abdur Rahman," aka "Numair," aka "Numair Abd
Rahman," aka "Shihab Numair Abd Rahman," aka "Numair Abd Rahman
Ash-Sheena," aka "Emir," ("WASHINGTON"), who was incarcerated
with defendant JAMES at the California State Prison-Sacramento,
gave an oath of allegiance to defendant JAMES and joined JIS.

10 7. On or about November 29, 2004, defendant WASHINGTON 11 was paroled from the California State Prison-Sacramento.

12 8. Paragraphs One through Seven of this Indictment are
13 incorporated by reference and realleged in each of the Counts
14 below as if set forth in full.

COUNT ONE 1 [18 U.S.C. § 2384] 2 OBJECTS OF THE CONSPIRACY 3 From a date unknown to the Grand Jury but at least 9. 4 since December 2004, and continuing to July 5, 2005, in Los 5 Angeles and Orange Counties, within the Central District of 6 California, and elsewhere, defendants JAMES, WASHINGTON, GREGORY 7 PATTERSON, aka "Bilal," ("PATTERSON"), and HAMMAD SAMANA 8 ("SAMANA") did knowingly, willfully, and unlawfully combine, 9 conspire, confederate, and agree together and with persons known 10 and unknown to the Grand Jury, to levy a war against the 11 Government of the United States through terrorism, and to oppose 12 by force the authority thereof, all in violation of Title 18, 13 United States Code, Section 2384. 14 15 MEANS BY WHICH THE OBJECTS OF THE CONSPIRACY WERE TO BE ACCOMPLISHED 16 17 10. The objects of the conspiracy were to be accomplished 18 in substance as follows: 19 Leadership of Defendant JAMES 20 Defendant JAMES would and did provide a. 21 instructions, spiritual and tactical guidance, and support to 22 defendants WASHINGTON, PATTERSON, and SAMANA, in carrying out the 23 war against the United States Government through terrorism. 24 United States Military Targets 25 b. Members of the conspiracy would and did target and 26 conduct surveillance of United States military facilities, such 27 as recruitment centers and military bases, in the Los Angeles 28 4

area, in preparation to kill United States military personnel. 1 Members of the conspiracy would and did plan their c. 2 methods of attack on United States military facilities, including 3 the types of weapons to use, in order to maximize the number of 4 casualties to be inflicted. 5 Government of Israel Targets 6 d. Members of the conspiracy would and did target and 7 conduct surveillance of Government of Israel facilities in the 8 Los Angeles area, including the Israeli Consulate and El Al, the 9 national airline of Israel, in preparation to kill Israeli 10 officials. 11 Synagogues 12 Members of the conspiracy would and did target and e. 13 conduct surveillance of synagogues in the Los Angeles area in 14 preparation to kill Jewish persons. 15 Members of the conspiracy would and did plan to f. 16 attack synagogues in the Los Angeles area on Jewish holidays, in 17 order to maximize the number of casualties to be inflicted. 18 Procurement of Weapons 19 Members of the conspiracy would and did purchase, g. 20 solicit others to purchase on their behalf, and otherwise acquire 21 weapons, including firearms, which would be used to carry out 22 their planned attacks. 23 Financing 24 Members of the conspiracy would and did commit h. 25 armed robberies of gas stations, and provide financial support to 26 each other, in order to purchase weapons, including firearms, and 27 otherwise fund their conspiracy. 28 5

Training 1 Members of the conspiracy would and did engage in i. 2 firearms training and physical training in preparation for 3 carrying out their planned attacks against United States military 4 facilities, Government of Israel targets, and synagogues. 5 Recruitment 6 Members of the conspiracy would and did attempt to i. 7 recruit others to join the conspiracy and otherwise support it. 8 Concealment of Activities 9 k. Members of the conspiracy would and did conceal 10 from law enforcement the manner in which the members carried out 11 the conspiracy, the locations at which members discussed and 12 carried out the conspiracy, and the locations at which members 13 stored and possessed weapons, including firearms, and maintained 14 the finances of the conspiracy, including the proceeds from gas 15 station robberies. 16 OVERT ACTS 17 11. In furtherance of the conspiracy and to accomplish the 18 objects of the conspiracy, the defendants and their co-19 conspirators committed the following overt acts, among others, in 20 Los Angeles and Orange Counties, within the Central District of 21 California, and elsewhere: 22 a. In or about December 2004, defendant JAMES 23 instructed defendant WASHINGTON to (1) recruit five individuals 24 without felony convictions and train them in covert operations; 25 (2) acquire two firearms with silencers; and (3) appoint an 26 individual from the group he recruited to find contacts for 27 explosives or learn to make bombs that could be activated from a 28

1 distance.

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2 b. In or about December 2004, defendant WASHINGTON
3 advised defendant JAMES that he was prepared to follow defendant
4 JAMES to victory or martyrdom.

c. Between in or about December 2004 and July 5, 2005, defendant JAMES advised defendant WASHINGTON about security for the planned war against the United States Government through terrorism.

9 d. Between in or about December 2004 and July 5,
10 2005, defendant WASHINGTON reaffirmed his allegiance to defendant
11 JAMES by pledging his loyalty until death by martyrdom.

e. Between in or about December 2004 and July 5,
2005, defendant WASHINGTON informed defendant JAMES of defendant
SAMANA's suitability for the planned war against the United
States Government through terrorism.

f. Between in or about December 2004 and July 5,
2005, defendant PATTERSON used a computer to conduct internet
research on El Al, the national airline of Israel, located at the
Los Angeles International Airport.

g. Between in or about December 2004 and July 5,
2005, defendant PATTERSON used a computer to conduct internet
research on Jewish events in Los Angeles for Yom Kippur in
October 2005.

h. On or about March 21, 2005, defendant JAMES
advised defendant WASHINGTON of his efforts to have defendant
PATTERSON visit him at the California State Prison-Sacramento,
and offered guidance regarding defendant WASHINGTON's recruitment
efforts.

i. In or about March or April 2005, defendant WASHINGTON attempted to recruit an individual to join the conspiracy.

j. Beginning on or about May 19, 2005, and continuing through on or about June 7, 2005, defendant PATTERSON used a computer to conduct internet research on the Israeli Consulate in Los Angeles.

k. On or about May 30, 2005, defendant PATTERSON
9 robbed a gas station in Los Angeles, California.

In or about June 2005, defendant WASHINGTON
 attempted to recruit an individual to join the conspiracy.

12 m. On or about June 6, 2005, defendant WASHINGTON, 13 armed with a shotgun, and defendant PATTERSON robbed a gas 14 station in Torrance, California.

15 n. On or about June 12, 2005, defendant PATTERSON, 16 armed with a shotgun, and defendant SAMANA robbed a gas station 17 in Playa Del Rey, California.

On or about June 16, 2005, defendant PATTERSON,
 armed with a shotgun, robbed a gas station in Torrance,
 California.

p. On or about June 18, 2005, defendant PATTERSON,
armed with a shotgun, robbed a gas station in Bellflower,
California.

q. On or about June 20, 2005, defendant PATTERSON,
armed with a shotgun, attempted to rob a gas station in Los
Angeles, California.

27 r. On or about June 21, 2005, defendant PATTERSON,
28 armed with a shotgun, robbed a gas station in Pico Rivera,

On or about June 21, 2005, defendant PATTERSON, s. 2 armed with a shotgun, robbed a gas station in Walnut, California. 3 t. On or about June 21, 2005, defendant SAMANA robbed 4 a gas station in Orange, California. 5 u. On or about July 3, 2005, defendant PATTERSON used 21 a computer to conduct internet research on Jewish events in Los 22 Angeles during the months of July and August. 23 aa. 12. The allegations in Count One of this Indictment are incorporated by reference and realleged herein as if set forth in full.\_\_\_\_\_

13. From a date unknown to the grand jury but at least since March 2005, and continuing to July 5, 2005, in Los Angeles and Orange Counties, within the Central District of California, and elsewhere, defendants WASHINGTON, PATTERSON, and SAMANA did knowingly, willfully, and unlawfully combine, conspire, confederate, and agree together and with persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury, to kill, with premeditation and malice aforethought, members of the United States Government uniformed services, while such members were engaged in or on account of the performance of official duties, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1111 and 1114, all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1117. 

## COUNT THREE

#### [18 U.S.C. § 1117]

3 14. The allegations in Count One of this Indictment are 4 incorporated by reference and realleged herein as if set forth in 5 full.

15. From a date unknown to the grand jury but at least since March 2005, and continuing to July 5, 2005, in Los Angeles and Orange Counties, within the Central District of California, and elsewhere, defendants WASHINGTON, PATTERSON, and SAMANA did knowingly, willfully, and unlawfully combine, conspire, confederate, and agree together and with persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury, to kill, with premeditation and malice aforethought, foreign officials, namely, officials of the Government of Israel, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1111 and 1116, all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1117.

From a date unknown to the grand jury but at least 18. 6 since December 2004, and continuing to July 5, 2005, in Los 7 Angeles and Orange Counties, within the Central District of 8 California, and elsewhere, defendants JAMES, WASHINGTON, 9 PATTERSON, and SAMANA did knowingly, willfully, and unlawfully 10 combine, conspire, confederate, and agree together and with 11 persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury, to possess and 12 discharge firearms, including destructive devices, as defined in 13 Title 18, United States Code, Section 921(a)(4), in furtherance 14 of a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a 15 court of the United States, namely, Conspiracy to Levy War 16 Against the United States Government Through Terrorism, in 17 viclation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2384, as 18 charged in Count One of this Indictment, Conspiracy to Kill 19 Members of the United States Government Uniformed Services, in 20 violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1117, as 21 charged in Count Two of this Indictment, and Conspiracy to Kill 22 Foreign Officials, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, 23 Section 1117, as charged in Count Three of this Indictment, all 24 in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c) and 25 924(o). 26
