20	On or about November 30, 2012, in the District of Arizona, the defendant, ABDULLATIF	
21	ALI ALDOSARY, maliciously damaged, destroyed and attempted to damage and destroy, by

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g) and 924(a)(2).

Forfeiture Allegation

As a result of committing the foregoing offenses as listed in Count One through Count Two,
as alleged in the Indictment, defendant ABDULLATIF ALI ALDOSARY, shall forfeit to the
United States, pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d) and Title 28, United
States Code, Section 2461, all firearms and ammunition involved in the commission of the
offense, including, but not limited to the firearm listed in Count Two.

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant; (1) cannot be located upon exercise of due diligence; (2) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person; (3) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court; (4) has been substantially diminished in value; or (5) has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty; it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other property of said defendant up to the value of the above forfeitable property.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d) and Title 28, United States
Code, Section 2461.
